Dr. Polyxeni Mangoulia is Assistant Professor of Psychiatric Nursing and Psychopharmacology at the Faculty of Nursing, School of Health Sciences, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (Laboratory of "Nursing Counseling Support and Psychoeducation for Patients with Mental Illness and Caregivers," Sector of Mental Health and Behavioral Sciences, NKUA).

Her doctoral dissertation was the first study in Greece on secondary traumatic stress/compassion fatigue and compassion satisfaction. She holds two master's degrees: (1) MSc in Liaison Psychiatry: Integrated Care of Physical and Mental Health from the Medical School of NKUA, and (2) MSc in Management and Administration of Healthcare Services from the Faculty of Nursing, NKUA. Additionally, she holds two Nursing Specializations: (1) Mental Health Nursing and (2) Emergency and Intensive Care Nursing.

Dr. Mangoulia teaches five undergraduate courses (Psychiatric Nursing, Liaison Mental Health Nursing, Communication Skills, Gerontological Nursing, Clinical Nursing) and two postgraduate courses in the Master's Program "Mental Health" (Addictions, Substance Use, and Psychopathology, Special Topics in Psychiatric Nursing). Furthermore, she teaches in postgraduate programs of other Departments and Universities, such as the Medical School of NKUA, the University of Thessaly, and the University of West Attica, as well as at the National Center for Public Administration and Local Government. She is a certified Trainer for Adults by the National Organization for the Certification of Qualifications and Vocational Guidance. Dr. Mangoulia has over 16 years of experience as a Clinical Nurse and Mental Health Professional at the "Evangelismos" General Hospital of Athens, where she held key positions in various clinical units, including the High Dependency Unit, Psychiatric Clinic, Community Mental Health Center of Pangrati, Liaison Psychiatry - Outpatient Psychiatric Clinic, and the Office of Education and Nursing Specialties. She has also served as an Academic Fellow at the Faculty of Nursing, University of West Attica.

As a Mental Health Counselor - Psychotherapist, she specializes in Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and Psychoeducation for individuals, groups, and families and she is also a co-therapist on art therapy. She has conducted and participated in numerous experiential workshops, seminars, and conferences. She is also a member of administrative and scientific committees and has supervised a significant number of master's and doctoral theses. Additionally, she serves on the three-member Central

Examination Committee for the Nursing Specialty "Mental Health Nursing" at the Ministry of Health.
